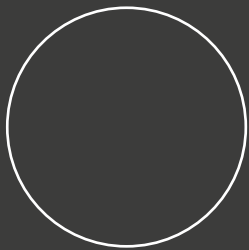


# UK INTERNET GOVERNANCE MEETING

## WHAT IS THE UK IGF?

The UK Internet Governance Forum (UK IGF) is the national IGF for the United Kingdom. IGFs are an initiative led by the United Nations for the discussion of public policy issues relating to the internet. A key distinguishing feature of IGFs is that they are based on the multi-stakeholder model – all sectors of society meet as equals to exchange ideas and discuss best practices. The purpose of IGF is to facilitate a common understanding of how to maximise the opportunities of the internet whilst mitigating the risks and challenges that the internet presents.

## WHAT ARE THE OUTPUTS?

The UK IGF is not a decision-making body but it is influential as a forum for public policy discussion in the UK. The day is usually well attended by the UK government and provides an opportunity to create a UK consensus on critical policy issues related to the internet. Messages from the UK IGF are compiled into a report and carried to the Global UN IGF. Videos of the day are available on the website.



## WHAT ARE THE AIMS AND OBJECTIVES?

The UK IGF facilitates multi-stakeholder dialogue to share expertise and best practice. Where possible, it aims to identify common ground. This enables the UK IGF to pull together a national UK perspective on internet related issues and promote this internationally. It is a forum for starting and facilitating discussion rather than finalising it.

## WHO ORGANISES THE UK IGF?

The UK IGF is organised in a bottom-up manner. The content of the programme is initiated and shaped by all participating stakeholders and open for everyone.

## FACTS AND FIGURES: UK IGF 2021

From 20th – 21st October 2021, 145 delegates from government, civil society, parliament, industry, the technical community, and academia met virtually to discuss The Future of the Internet. The content was aligned to the five themes: Trust, Inclusion, Data, Environment and Covid-19. Our speakers were more

diverse and better representative of the UK than ever before, with 58% of speakers being female and 35% being BAME. This continues to be central in terms of how UK IGF is designed to ensure the discussions are truly relevant to the experiences of all UK digital citizens.
